From our Lay Director

Zandra Pennylegion

It seems people don't necessarily remember what they are told of God's love, but they never forget what they have experienced of God's love.

-Steve Sjogren

Reading the above quote as part of my daily morning devotions caused me to meditate on what an experiential people we are. And that often when we are greatly moved by an experience, we want others to experience it too – however in our human frailty we want them also to experience it *in exactly the same way we did.* Sometimes, we take the task on ourselves trying to create, or duplicate, the experience instead of releasing it to God who through the Holy Spirit has a very specific, and different, experience for each individual. God did not create any two people exactly alike ... no two lives are exactly the same ... and so too, our experiences are different. The end result should, however be the same ... to glorify God by doing God's Will and fulfilling God's purpose for our lives ... *our* lives, not everyone else's. What a release! I only have to fulfill God's purpose for me and glorify God!

Recently I heard a pastor sharing his experiences as the principal of a Christian school. He related that while the teaching during the school year was solid and the students gained knowledge, it was the summer camps that had the most impact. He noted that while the information taught at the camps was the same as at school, there was something about drawing apart from the world, being in a Christian community for a period of time, that opened the students up and allowed the Holy Spirit really to work, and in that setting individuals were changed by the experience – the experience of God's love.

I reflected that this is what also happens on a Cursillo weekend. However, the Cursillo method recognizes that it is not the individual experience that is to be focused on, but rather how each person allows that experience to work in him or her – what we do with the rest of our lives to demonstrate God's love and draw the world to Jesus. What we call our "4th day" as we go forth into the world "and make disciples of all nations ..." (*Mt* 28:19). The strength of the method lies in continuing the community experienced on the weekend, in supporting and encouraging each other through grouping, ultreyas and Spiritual Direction.

As Niagara Cursillo begins a year of renewal, I have spent quite a bit of time reading the "official literature" (The National Episcopal Cursillo manuals) and meditating on being God's servant. Secretariat has an awesome task and busy year ahead – reading the NEC literature, understanding the intent and purpose of the Cursillo method, planning stewardship visits to revitalize Niagara Cursillo, reviewing all aspects of running weekends, and planning a Renewal Retreat in the fall. We ask for your prayers throughout this year and especially as we meet the second Saturday each month.

As weather and schedule permit I look forward to attending

From our Spiritual Director

Sunday, January 21, was a great Cursillo Feast. We gathered as a community for a regional Ultreya in Milton. We began as usual with a Eucharist and spirit-filled music. The witness talk was given by John Page, after which we broke into groups and discussed the witness talk. It was a chance to share our faith journey in a different way than in the traditional grouping. Secretariat decided that we would try this instead of grouping since several people had expressed concern about the 'floating group reunion.' We need your feedback. Lise Simmons and her Fourth Day Committee would be interested in your comments on this way of grouping.

The Ultreya was also a chance for us as a community to bid farewell to the Rev. Trish McCarthy and Art Howell. Since coming to Niagara Trish and Art have been very active in the Cursillo Movement. We have been blessed by their ministry and wish them God's speed in their journey to Alberta.

Our year of renewal has begun. Secretariat has begun a prayerful study of the Cursillo Movement looking at the official literature of the movement as well as gleaning insight and inspiration from our Roman Catholic brothers and sisters.

We find as we begin to look at the official material, that there are many instances where we do not follow the guidelines. Over the next few months Secretariat will be looking at each of these differences; determining why we differ and trying to discern whether or not what we are doing augments or detracts from the Cursillo experience. Although this effort is primarily focused on the weekend, we will also be looking at everything that we do to ensure that we are keeping to the method and purpose of the Movement.

It has been said that Cursillo is predominately a lay Movement but that is not correct and it is not what the official literature says. Below is an excerpt from the official literature "National Episcopal Cursillo".

"For years, Cursillo was often described as a 'lay movement.' But, from the beginning, Cursillo was understood as a 'movement of the Church' involving all orders of ministry and equipping ministers, lay and ordained, to be apostles for Jesus Christ. The role of clergy in Cursillo is essentially the role of clergy in the Church. In ways that are appropriate for each order, clergy are expected to function prophetically within the Cursillo Movement. That is, they are to challenge the cursillistas – at whatever level of responsibility they have – to know, understand and be faithful to the Cursillo strategy and Method."

Another part of our future plans involves determining

- What does Cursillo mean to you?
- How can we as a community support your ministry?

To get the answers to these questions, a committee has been struck to develop a plan for reaching as many of you as possible. The aim is to develop a plan for the future. More information on the initiative will be distributed shortly.

Change is not something we should shy away from, or fear. God is with us through it all.

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth be moved, and though the mountains be toppled into the depths of the sea; though its waters rage and foam, and though the mountains tremble at its tumult. The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our stronghold.

POST CURSILLO / 4TH DAY Lise Simmons

I would like to start off by saying how wonderful our last Diocesan Ultreya was! On January 21 we met at Grace Church in Milton, where we started with our Eucharist service, then the Ultreya, followed by a potluck supper. We were blessed to have the Rev. Trish McCarthy as the Celebrant, this being her last time at a Niagara Cursillo event. She and her husband Art were preparing to move out west. It was a blessing to see how God worked through Pastor Trish and our witness speaker, John Page, weaving the theme "Here I am, Lord" and following God's leading, when neither one knew what the other was going to talk about. We serve an awesome God! We were also encouraged by the attendance. There were 72 people at the Ultreya and 63 stayed for supper.

We tried a new format during the Ultreya grouping time. Instead of sharing our faith, study and action, the groups were asked to discuss the witness talk and what it meant to them. This grouping method was well received, judging by the comments we received afterwards.

I would like to encourage everyone to plan on coming to the next Diocesan Ultreya, Sunday March 18. Receiving Emails

I have heard that some Cursillistas are experiencing problems in receiving emails. The problem, of course, could be that our distribution list does not include the most up-to-date email addresses. So, please make sure you notify the Communications Chair if your email address changes.

However, on many occasions when I have received queries about email addresses, when I check our list I find we do, in fact, have the correct address.

We know that some internet servers view emails originating from a '.org' address as 'junk' or 'spam' and they do not deliver these emails to a user's *Inbox*. Rather, they are put into a 'Junk' or 'Spam' mailbox. The user would have to access the junk email folder to see emails from niagaracursillo.org.

When accessing the Junk Email box, some servers allow the user to identify a message as 'Junk' or 'Not Junk'. By identifying the message as 'Not Junk', future emails from the same address will be delivered to the *Inbox* instead of the *Junk* box.

In other cases, adding our email address to your address book <communications@niagaracursillo.org> will prevent email from us from being discarded as junk or spam.

So, you can help your fellow Cursillistas. If you hear a comment that someone is not receiving emails from Cursillo (Prayer requests, Rainbow, other communications) please suggest that he or she look in the 'Junk' or 'Spam' box. Hopefully, our emails will be there. In this way we can help all Cursillistas to be kept up to date.

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PRE-CURSILLO John Pennylegion

Since I accepted the position of Pre-Cursillo Chair, the primary activity of the committee has been organizing our display table at the Diocesan Synod on November 26, 2006.

We spent some time reading the NEC manuals and creating new materials which focused more on the Cursillo Method of Grouping, Ultrevas and Spiritual Direction, and less on the weekend. We created a new brochure, "business cards" with contact info and information on all regional ultreyas, and a PowerPoint presentation to run on the Cursillo laptop. Based on all of that material, we also re-did our trifold display board. Along with the Cursillo banner and the past two weekend banners, our table looked very impressive, if I do say so myself! As I was otherwise occupied that day, our Lay Director, Zandra, 'personed' the table and our Spiritual Director, Rev. Susan Wells, also helped out on breaks when she could. Compared to last year's Synod, the number of displays in the exhibit area was about half, and with only a one-day Synod we did not have as much over-all traffic in the area as last year. However, we felt the Cursillo table itself had more non-cursillistas drop by than last year. We now have some clergy to follow up with, to discuss possible presentations or other ways to introduce Cursillo to their parishes.

Future plans are to provide displays at various diocesan events and to arrange for presentations to parishes throughout the diocese.

I will be need a full committee to plan these activities and if anyone is interested in being involved in Pre-Cursillo, please let me know.
