Spiritual Director's Report – Rev Susan Wells

'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine-grower. ²He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. ³You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. ⁴Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. ⁵I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart

from me you can do nothing. (John 15:1-5)

Since 1990, when I had my Cursillo weekend, the Cursillo community has helped me to abide in Jesus. All of you have had Cursillo weekends. Many of you would say it had a profound effect on your faith journey. And that is wonderful because Cursillo has always been about pointing the way to God and calling us to our part in the extension of God's Kingdom here are earth.

However, it is easy to get busy doing ministry in your parish and put Cursillo on the back-burner as something you no longer have time for or something you no longer need..And maybe that is how it should be.

Cursillo has a role to play in our bishop's vision and in the ministry of our parishes. Just as it possibly did for you – Cursillo can encourage a deeper relationship with God and a more "passionate spirituality" within an individual which can carry over to the parish– This is part of the Bishop's vision. Another part of the Bishop's vision is life giving worship – which I, for one, have experienced through Cursillo especially at the closing service for weekend #43.

I believe that God is calling us to use the Cursillo method to create passionate disciples for Christ. To do this **we need your help. There are two ways in which you can help.**

- We need you to identify people in your parish who could benefit from a Cursillo weekend – to talk to your clergy and then to sponsor them. Sponsorship is not some great onerous task – it is about being a mentor. Think about it. I know that each of you know people who God is calling to Cursillo. The logistics can always be worked out – there is a whole community of Cursillistas out there to help you.
- We need you to contributions to the Sponsorship fund. Last year the sponsorship fund paid ³/₄ of the weekend cost for all participants. Money should not be the determining factor as to whether or not someone can attend a Cursillo weekend. Please consider completing the PreAuthorized Giving Form in this Rainbow. A gift of \$20 per month would sponsor one person on a weekend plus leave \$40 to go towards general operating expenses. \$10 oer month would sponsor ¹/₂ a person.

As we move towards Pentecost my prayer for you is that your heart will be filled with the spirit of the Risen Christ.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT/DONATIONS

Please consider a donation to Cursillo Niagara.

Cursillo Niagara is a non-subsidized organization relying entirely on donations and pledges from individuals. It does not receive any Diocesan or Corporate financial support.

Cursillo Niagara has a Sponsorship Fund. This Fund subsidizes the cost of a Three-Day Weekend for all participants. Team members working on a Weekend, are required to pay the full cost themselves.

Other expenses incurred by Cursillo Niagara include advertising, brochures, publication of the newsletter, annual National Cursillo apportionment, travel expenses for our delegates to attend National Cursillo meetings, and operating costs.

There are various ways to financially support the organization.

- 1. **Pre-Authorized Payment:** this is the most beneficial method for both the organization and the donor. A PAP is automatic and once in place requires no further action. Cursillo Niagara receives your stipulated donation regularly. At the end of the year, PAP donors receive a tax receipt for their yearly donations. As an example, \$20 a month equals \$240 a year which, at current costs, pays for one participant to attend a Cursillo Weekend. Here is the Link to the PAP form for your convenience. Just fill out and mail to the Treasurer, address below.
- 2. **J.O.G. (Joy of Giving) Envelopes:** These are available at Regional and Diocesan Ultreyas, and should be given to or mailed to the treasurer in the pre-addressed envelope.
- 3. **Toonie or Loonie Film Cans:** These small cans hold 50 toonies or loonies and are an excellent way of donating a part of your small change! Also available at Ultreyas.
- 4. **Spontaneous, periodic donations:** Any donation is gratefully received.

Whichever method you use, an annual income tax receipt is issued by the Diocese of Niagara.

Trying to Explain: Weekend Nov. 2005

I know I don't need to explain, but I feel like I want to explain what happened from my point of view in the closing Eucharist at Cursillo 2005.

Someone I very much respect had made the comment to the effect that we do not want the leaders to fall apart during a Cursillo weekend and it had happened before. I was a table leader that weekend and it was a wonderful weekend. We came to the closing Eucharist and I felt the Holy Spirit at work as we began to praise. As often happens for me that brings a desire to cry, only this time I could feel the sobs starting to rise. I was faced with a dilemma; was I going to 'look good' or was I going to let God do what I thought he wanted to do. I chose the latter. It was a little embarrassing though I wasn't really embarrassed, as I sobbed those belly shaking sobs through the service. A friend from church who is prone to get teary eyed during services commented to the effect that I made him look good. ©

After Communion, I went to the ladies room and as I continued to sob, I said, "God what is going on?" What went through my head was, "I am setting you free from fear." I figured I would know if that was true in the working out of my life.

Lots has happened since then as I have worked through facing different fears, but the reason I am writing this now is that we got back a few weeks ago from a trip to Whistler with three of our sons and I experienced a freedom from a fear that has plagued me for years. When I was young I was not afraid of heights, but one time visiting Hilton Falls as an adult, I went to step down to a ledge on the cliff face and did not judge the distance properly. I was facing into the gorge and as I stepped down farther than I expected to it almost catapulted me forward and scared me half to death as I realized I could have died, hmm, maybe it is actually a fear of death. After that I went on a small Gondola ride at Lake George, NY and found that I was scared and it was not fun! Anyways, while we were at Whistler I rode the Peak to Peak Gondola ride and loved it! I looked down and studied the trail 1400 feet or 436 metres below and enjoyed the beautiful scenery. This experience made me want to share my new found freedom with those who may have witnessed my state during Cursillo and wondered what was going on. "It is for freedom that Christ has set us free (Gal. 5:1a)." Ultreya.

Nominations Requested for 2010 Secretariat

All Cursillistas who are members of the Niagara Anglican Cursillo Movement are invited to attend this year's Annual General Meeting which will be held on Sunday, September 13, 2009. Location and time to be determined.. Part of this year's business will be to elect several members to serve on Secretariat for a two year term.

Article 12 of the By-laws that governs the nomination of persons for Secretariat is reproduced below:

12. The nominating committee shall be responsible for presenting a slate of names to fill the vacancies arising on the Secretariat to the AGM. In addition, any member of the Cursillo Community may be nominated by another member, using the following guidelines:

a) The person making the nomination will write a letter to the nominating committee giving brief details of the experience of the person being nominated, and indicating that s/he has been approached and is willing to accept the nomination.

b) These nominations where feasible should provide geographic representation among members of the Secretariat. All persons nominated must agree to follow the screening procedures as outlined in the Code.

c) Nominations will be accepted from the floor of the AGM. If someone nominated from the floor is elected, their election will not be ratified until the elected person has fulfilled the requirements of the screening procedure as outlined in the code. As soon as is practical, the nominating chair will present to the Lay Director, who in turn will present to the Wider Community, the names and brief details of the experience of those people nominated. When an election takes place at an AGM, it shall be done by secret ballot and a majority decision will be accepted. In the case of a tie, the Lay Director will cast the deciding vote.

Nominations from the wider community should be submitted *in writing*, either by e-mail or hard copy. Every nomination should provide brief details of the person being nominated and confirmation that each one is willing to let his/her name stand.
