From Our Lay Director

We have two members of Secretariat that will be completing their 4 year terms in September 2011. They are Richard Turner and Laura McKenzie. I wish to personally thank these two members for their dedication to Secretariat over the last 4 years. There will be two members completing their first 2 year term, namely John Newton and Shirley Kitchen. This year saw the introduction of an interim Spiritual Director, the Rev. Stephanie Pellow who filled in superbly for Canon Susan Wells who took a short medical leave of absence. I am grateful to both Spiritual Directors for their support and assistance to me.

I wish to thank also all the members of Secretariat for their dedication to the Cursillo movement in the Niagara Diocese.

I have personally been a member of Secretariat for the past 5 years, the last 2 of which I served as your Lay Director. My 2 year term as Lay Director will end in September of this year. At the Bishop's discretion I have the option to renew my position as Lay Director however, for personal reasons I have decided not to exercise this option. I have advised Bishop Michael Bird accordingly. Secretariat will therefore be required to seek a new Lay Director subject to Bishop Michael Bird's approval.

I hope to see as many of you as possible at the AGM which will be held at Church of The Nativity on Sunday, September 11, 2011 at 3:00 p.m.

Have you ever heard anyone say, "You can never go back." I don't agree with them. When my late husband, Don, and I decided we could no longer manage three children, three jobs, commitment to our church congregation and continue what had been a ten year commitment to Cursillo, it was involvement with Cursillo that we decided to give up. We both agreed that someday we would be back. Don's battle with cancer and his passing in 2007 did not allow him the opportunity. I was welcomed back by the Ultreya group in Guelph which meets once a month in the homes of members of the group. I found there exactly what I thought I would always find - acceptance, caring and faith in Christ practiced and celebrated. This Ultreya group doesn't function just like some of the large events I remember from the past but the purpose for the gathering has not changed. We come together to pray, learn from each other and encourage each other to use our God-given gifts to do the work of Christ.

In September 2010, I accepted an appointment to Cursillo Niagara Secretariat as Clergy-at-Large. I didn't know exactly what to expect or what would be expected of me at first but found myself working with a group of individuals dedicated to promoting Cursillo in the Dioceses of Niagara and Huron, willing to support each other's efforts and sustain each other with prayer. Our Secretariat is only "the tip of the ice berg" of the large number of people who have attended a Cursillo Weekend in our diocese but it is very important in the process of organizing and providing direction to the whole group. I had planned to keep my ears open for the first little while to learn as much as I could from those with more recent experience with Cursillo than myself. Cursillo teaches us to plan our apostolic action but God expects us to be flexible. So, when our Spiritual Director, Reverend Susan Wells, suffered a broken ankle, with the blessing of Secretariat and Bishop Michael Bird, I became Interim Spiritual Director. The learning curve became a little steeper.

In March/April, I had the privilege of being part of the team on Weekend #46 at Mount Mary. We welcomed Reverend Mark Gladding as one of the Spiritual Advisors for the first time. One of my goals was to contact clergy in Greater Wellington, Trafalgar, and parts of Hamilton to encourage them first to attend an Ultreya and later to attend or encourage parishioners to attend Weekend # 46 in March/April. One thing I learned was that many of the clergy need a great deal more lead time prior to an event than we were able to give them before the recent Cursillo Weekend. I plan to continue to invite clergy to Cursillo events as we move towards Weekend # 47 in May 2012.

At our June Secretariat Meeting, we took time to share with each other what Cursillo has meant and continues to mean to each one of us. What started as a simple exercise became heartfelt witness and a moving spiritual experience. It enabled each one there to rededicate himself or herself to offering this gift that we have in Cursillo to others. I encourage you to take a few moments and bring to mind how you have been encouraged, how you have grown in your faith, and how you may have felt the love of God through your experience of Cursillo. I said at the beginning that I don't agree with the statement, "You can never go back." So, I would encourage you to come back again or continue to be involved with Cursillo in our Diocese. Don't expect everything to be exactly the same. Do expect that you will find welcome, be valued, and be met with caring from a group of people who want to share the love of Christ with you and with others.

Niagara Anglican Cursillo Movement Minutes of the Annual General Meeting

Held Sunday, September 12, 2010 At Church of the Nativity, Hamilton.

1. Call to order

Nancy Harris, Lay Director and Chair called the meeting to order at 3:12 pm. and welcomed everyone. Rev. Susan Wells led the opening prayer.

2. Welcome

Nancy asked if everyone had signed the attendance record. All 26 people in attendance signed the sheet.

3. Minutes of the previous AGM.

- a) No errors or omissions were found.
- b) MOTION: Nancy Wood/ Larry Collinson "That the minutes of the September 13th 2009 Annual General Meeting, as published in the Rainbow, be accepted."

4. The Lay Director's Report was published in the August Rainbow.

Nancy thanked Secretariat for their work over the past year and introduced the members of Secretariat, explaining that Susan Little, Jan Collinson and Laurie McDowell had finished their terms of office and would be stepping down.

5. The Spiritual Director's Report.

Rev. Susan Wells gave a verbal report. She talked about the differences in the roles of Lay Director and Spiritual Director. Susan told of her work trying to inform the clergy about Cursillo. She felt a disconnection between the discussions she had experienced with clergy, at various levels, which were positive and the lack of support for the programme. Susan feels we need to work to resolve this stumbling block.

There was a request, from the floor that Susan's report be put in writing and published on the web site. She agreed to do this.

6. Reports from Secretariat, all published in the August Rainbow.

7. Treasurer's Report for 2009/2010 and Budget for 2010/2011

a) Financial Statements.

Jan Collinson, the Treasurer, gave an overview of the statements. She explained that the Sponsorship fund was growing. That it had financed the past two Weekends and had been a great help to the participants.

b) Budget for 2010/2011

Jan explained that the budget was roughly the same as last year.

The cost of the Weekend depends on the number of participants. It is therefore difficult to be sure of the cost for the budget. Hopefully we will have more participants at the Weekend this year.

The cost of the two Weekends had exhausted the Sponsorship Fund but the amount of money going into it should begin to build this year. Jan hopes eventually to be able to cover the costs for the leaders at the Weekends.

There was a lengthy discussion about transferring money from the General Fund to the Sponsorship Fund and how that should be recorded in the budget.

"That if there is a deficit in funding for a Weekend, enough money should be transferred from the General Fund to the Sponsorship Fund to cover the cost of the Sponsorship portion of the Weekend"

"That the Budget be approved as amended"

8. Spirtual Director

Susan Wells rose to speak about the PAP programme. She feels strongly that if members of Cursillo were to sign up for the PAP program and donate \$10 on the 15th or the 30th of each month we would have enough funds to support this worthy cause which can make a profound difference in people's lives.
