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# **Rainbow Newsletter**

"Like the bow in a cloud on a rainy day such was the appearance of the splendor all around. This was the appearance of the glory of the Lord. Ezekiel 1.28

## 1. <u>Lay Director</u> (Susan Little)

Last spring I decided to try my skills at knitting so I joined a weekly group of women at our church. They were eager to show me the basics of casting on and a few different stitches. I even learned how to retrieve a dropped stitch! Although I could not attend every week, I was very proud at being able to create a dish cloth using the plain knitting stitch. I have been working on more dish cloths with fancier edging and hope to graduate to bigger items in the fall. However, I am very grateful to have acquired this new skill, especially because it has taught me a few things about God

and the way God works in community.

Psalm 139 verse 13 reminds us that God "created my innermost being". The psalmist asserts "You knit me together in my mother's womb." and concludes in verse 14 that "I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made, your works are wonderful. I know that full well".

The complexity of our human body and its intricate workings are the results of God's intentional work in us. When we contemplate the technological advances in surgery and medicine which bring healing and wholeness to our bodies, sometimes using invisible lasers and microscopic techniques, we can easily conclude with the psalmist that we are "fearfully and wonderfully made". Whenever we question our purpose in

life, this part of the psalm reminds us that God's Spirit is willing and ready to work within us to bring glory to God.

The 'knitting together' is an important understanding of how much God loves us, both as an individual person and also as a part of the human family. When applied to Cursillo, we begin to appreciate the ways God is working among us to make known the love of Jesus Christ for all people. When applied to Cursillo, we begin to 'see' the ways God uses our friendships and our relationships to bring out the best in one another and to create something lasting.

There are a few reasons why I think God is at work 'knitting' the fabric of Cursillo. Consider the recent search which Secretariat is launching to find new places for our Cursillo Weekends to occur. Finding the geographic centre to both Niagara and Huron dioceses is the target so that Cursillistas from both dioceses are not always advantaged or disadvantaged. In knitting, it is important to create space between each stitch so that a flexible fabric results. If it is too tight, it will be inflexible. Similarly, too much space between stitches will make the fabric too loose to be useful. The tension between the stitches on the needles is the challenging part of knitting and, through experience, the best product results when there is a good relationship between the knitting needles and the yarn. Too much pulling or pushing creates something useless. The result of our search will be a new facility which can deliver a Cursillo Weekend in the best way possible to meet the needs of its participants.

In addition to our search for a new conference centre, our membership is growing together in wonderful ways. Our new friendships from Weekend 51 have given us examples of new groupings and new Christian experiences. Throughout the weekend and the Team training events, we discovered people with a wide background of experience, skills and talents. Recently, some have been asked to share these with the Wider Community during the Empower workshops offered this October on Study and Prayer. If you look at the facilitators, you will see both familiar and unfamiliar names. Knitting them together will create new experiences and life for us all, strengthening the fabric of our lives.

Knitting is also occurring in the membership of Secretariat (the central committee of Cursillo Niagara / Huron) while saying good bye to a few members, like Rod McDowell, Victoria Baldwin and Larry Collinson. It is also welcoming new members like Anne Gould, Shirley Kitchen and Jan Collinson, Working with new and not so new members on a busy committee like Secretariat is a gift we have at the heart of our Cursillo. God is challenging us in Niagara and Huron dioceses to 'grow' Cursillo. As we begin the new program year, we are not sure what results the 'knitting' that God is doing among us will create. The Psalmist reminds us that God's "works are wonderful. I know that full well". (v.14). Therefore of one thing we are sure: God is working on this 'new creation' through us and among us, and we are definitely ready to do our part.

## 2. Spiritual Director (Rev. Stephanie Pellow)



One Sunday in August, the following phrases made up parts of the Collect, Prayer over the Gifts and Prayer after Communion.

"Give us grace to dedicate our freedom to your service, that all people may know the glorious liberty of the children of God."

"Give us the grace to live as faithful children."

"May we who have been nourished by holy things live as faithful heirs of your promised kingdom."

The theme of faithfulness, not through coercion or fear, not for social status or obligation of membership but as a free choice runs through all three prayers. Whenever I think of Christians I have met through Cursillo, I see that theme of choosing faithfulness embodied in them. To those who are retiring from our Secretariat at this time, I want to say a hearty "thank you". Your faithfulness as children of God, dedicating your freedom to service through this organization has been much appreciated. I also fully anticipate that those coming onto Secretariat bring the same attitude of faithfulness with them as they begin to learn their new roles. As Spiritual Director of Cursillo in Niagara, it has been my task and joy to encourage Cursillistas in their faith and to help develop leadership within the organization both for our own prosperity and that of the church in the Diocese of Niagara. One of our tasks in 2015-16 was to re-ignite interest in and commitment to regular group reunions. It is easy for any of us to say that we really don't have time for one more meeting but can we become conscious of the fact that this meeting is the foundation of everything else we do? It is a safe place for interpersonal care, prayer, and encouragement. If you are grouping regularly, I applaud and encourage you to continue. If you have lost or not made this important connection in Cursillo I would also encourage you to reach out and reconnect. It is refreshing and uplifting – like going to a spiritual spa with good friends. In the past year we have moved ahead with our partnership with Huron Diocese welcoming new Cursillistas from Huron and engaging two priests from Huron, Archdeacon Graham Bland and Rev. Mona Goulette, as Weekend Spiritual Advisors. Along with our Lay Director and Huron Laison, I will be meeting with Bishop Linda Nicolls in London in September to further this partnership. Bishop Nicolls has attended Cursillo.

During the past year, I have often worn two hats. As there was no Pre-Cursillo Chair, I assisted Marion Bailey, Weekend Chair, with the tasks usually assigned to Pre-Cursillo. It is my hope to hand those tasks over to a Pre-Cursillo Chair as we set up our Secretariat in October. I am also hoping that there will be a priest on Secretariat to prepare to take over the role of Spiritual Director in September 2017. My tenure has been a long one and I feel it is time for someone else to bring fresh ideas to the role. In the interim, I will continue to serve as faithfully as I am able because Cursillo is one of the vehicles through God has given me the freedom to serve.


Our music was provided by Susanne and Margaret.

Information from this publication identified 'The goal of the Weekend' as the empowerment of Christians to go into the world, equipped to witness to the wonder of being the Church. The Authentic Three Day Weekend is where the life of grace and the Cursillo Method become real and applicable to the lives of the participants.

The role of the Coordinator is to be a facilitator: to stand back and allow room for the working of the Holy Spirit. At every weekend, each team member has an integral role to play and each person is blessed with the responsibility of completing a very unique Cursillo Weekend Team – No two people are exactly alike, therefore, no two teams are exactly alike. Christ meets us exactly where we are!! There will be no other experience like it and none has gone before. The only similarities lie in the method – a reliable and time proven method -- The Cursillo Method.
