FROM OUR SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR

REV. SUSAN WELLS

It is hard to believe that Christmas has just ended and already we are moving into Lent. This is the earliest beginning of Lent in over 50 years. I have barely had time to catch my breath from Christmas and already find myself planning Ash Wednesday services. Cursillo too has barely had time to catch its breath.

For thus says the Lord: Only when Babylon's seventy years are completed will I visit you, and I will fulfill to you my promise and bring you back to this place. For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. Then when you call upon me and come and pray to me, I will hear you. When you search for me, you will find me; if you seek me with all your heart, I will let you find me, says the Lord (Jeremiah 29:10-14)

It is time for Cursillo to seek a new direction, to seek God with all our heart. It is then we will find God and the plans God has for this community.

As part of our plan to seek God, Secretariat decided a year ago to try and touch base with as many Cursillistas as possible to talk about their Cursillo experience and to get feedback on how Secretariat can best serve and support Cursillistas in their Christian journey and ministry. 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FROM OUR NEWEST SECRETARIAT MEMBER

(1 Cor 1:2-7 NRSV)

Community. Much of our work has been centered on discerning how best to create one community and to remove any barriers that might tend to separate the team and participants. Team and participants will be housed together. The back teams have been reduced in size; this will allow the team and participants to share in the operation of the weekend. The back team will be introduced on Thursday evening and will eat their meals with the participants. The Palanca chapel will be made available to both team and participants, all of whom will be encouraged to use this chapel for personal prayer and meditation. After the weekend, we will undertake a review to evaluate the changes. The main basis for the evaluation will be whether or not the participants and team were able to hear the voice of God through the events of the weekend.

The next Cursillo Weekend is scheduled for November 27-30, 2008. Marion Binns has agreed to coordinate this weekend. Marion has begun putting together her core team and after her winter vacation will assemble the rest of the team. Team training will begin in September. If you are called and asked to be on team, prayerfully consider whether God is calling you to be part of this new format.

Cursillo is blessed to have three clergy on Secretariat, myself as the Spiritual Director and the Rev. Paul Tinker and the Rev. Deacon St. Clair Cleveland as members at large. This marks the first time in a long while that there has been more than one clergy on Secretariat. Paul and St. Clair are both men of faith and I look forward to learning from them.

I also look forward to renewing acquaintances with some of you at the local meetings and at the 25th anniversary.

discipled by educational days of 'Walk in the Spirit'. And worshipping God and witnessing to the power of God working in our lives with Ultreyas. And I want to do my part in promoting it.

If you are asked to be on team, please consider this again before you give your answer!

WHAT AM I SAYING WHEN I SAY 'YES'?

The CoOrdinator of the next Weekend has just called and asked if you will prayerfully consider being on team! As you hit your knees, please give honest consideration to the following questions:

- Have I the time to give for:
 - o meetings?
 - o training sessions?
 - o reading the appropriate manual?
 - writing a talk or prayerfully supporting those doing so?
 - o praying for team (prayer palanca should begin as soon as names are known).
 - What are my commitments over the training months? Will they drain me of needed enthusiasm and energy so that I will not be able to go to team training and the Weekend rested and at my best to serve God and my brothers & sisters on this Weekend?
 - Have I checked my calendar carefully to make sure that I can attend every team training?
 - Am I able to make the financial commitment? (team members pay for their weekends just like the participants)
 - If my spouse is also asked to be on team, can we both make the commitment of time and money? Which of us should accept? (should we establish taking turns?)
 - Will my/our commitment allow adequate time for the children?
 - Am I planning to sponsor a participant? Will I be able to fulfill my responsibilities as a good sponsor? Will I be able to arrange to have someone get my participant to and from the facility, perform any needed duties for them (look after animals, etc.,) keep in touch with the spouse of the participant, etc.?
 - Can I set aside my own agenda with my own preferences, and honour the working of the Spirit through the leadership of the Weekend CoOrdinator?

Now that I have dealt honestly with these issues, I need to take some quiet time to listen to what the Holy Spirit is leading me to do. It is an honour and a privilege to serve on team.

Being on team is not *for* everyone; it is also a servant calling to serve "off team" as part of the Wider Community. Without the prayer support of the Wider Community, the Weekends would not be as strong and as Christ-centered as they are. It is indeed a gift to have time to do the extra palanca of prayer and sacrifice.

"Give me a discerning heart and spirit Lord. Do you want me to serve You on the team - or off the team? Either way, Lord, I am serving You."
