

As January blends into February, the empty landscape reveals the bare trees and profile of where we live. Its starkness reminds me of the backbone of what sustains us throughout the remaining months of the year. While at the Museum of Natural History in London recently, the immense skeletons of prehistoric life impressed me with how perfectly formed and symmetrical its bone structure was! It carried flesh and blood once upon a time and sustained its life form throughout generations and generations. By comparison, our wee bodies and skeletons look frail and vulnerable but one truth remains: the same creator created both species. Speaking for only one of the human sort, a single purpose exists for this skeleton of mine - to know, love and serve my Maker.

As Lent creeps up, I begin to plan what will best suit my needs in relationship to God. By extension, I begin to think about us all. I begin to realize the importance of our backbone, our basic framework upon which the rest of our life depends. When I think of 'skeleton' or 'backbone' with regard to Cursillo, I am taken back to the three talks early on the Cursillo Weekend, the ones about Faith, Study and Action. If you remember your



Cursillo Weekend, you will remember the struggle that the speaker probably had to keep the three-legged stool upright as the sign for each of the three Talks was added to the stool. Now, as these topics still form the 'backbone' of our Group Reunion, sometimes we still struggle to keep these three in balance. As we gather each week, we recognize that it is the fine balance of these three disciplines that help us journey

through the smooth and rough patches of our lives.

Although I learned quickly about the need for balance in my life with the 'tippy' three-legged stool, life experiences have taught me that the fourlegged model is much more practical for me. If you have a stool in your kitchen or elsewhere, you will know that most have four legs. There is more

stability and ease in its design. When I have to reach a top shelf, my four-legged stepping stool comes out. Tucked away between my stove and my cupboards, it is an essential in my home when I am decorating for a holiday or painting. Even in other rooms, this stool helps me reach the treasures I think I have stored in a far off spot.

When I am on the stool searching for something that I packed far away, I think of the stability my stool provides. I have recently



decided to label the fourth leg of the stool "Grace". As I understand it, Grace is a sign of God's presence in our midst. With this stool, God gives me the means to reach high so I can find what I need. With God, I can approach any question, fear or concern with confidence. God gives me confidence in my footing so that I will not wobble or fall.

Grace is the confidence God gives: it is the unexpected solution that solves the problem and brings peace. How can I plan for Grace? I can't. But in knowing that it is God's Spirit waiting to help me, God enables me to take risks and to go forward with what I feel God is calling me to do. I can't claim to have a monopoly on Grace but I can claim my baptismal promise as a Child of God to inherit the kingdom prepared for us. "Prepared" means open to God's presence in the midst of whatever situation, problem or crisis is occurring. It means God is already there, preparing the place for wherever I am going and making it better. The stability in my life, then, the fourth leg, is the Grace our God provides for us, day in and day out. God has been 'fleshing out' the backbone of our Triennial over the last month or so. In the last week of January, our Triennial Conference planning team is meeting together to finalize more details about the June 22-24 conference. Surprisingly, the presence of God's Grace continues to appear in our plans. Coincidence? I think not. Similarly, the details for the Ultreya in March is falling together nicely with amazing ease and simplicity. Hmmm. The Day of Deeper Understanding planned for April 14th is taking on its own shape and promise now, too. Another sign of Grace! Psalm 138 tells us God "answered me on the day I called. You gave me strength in my soul" (v.3). So here is the invitation, again. Call upon the Lord. Rely on the stability I call 'God's Grace' to make all things possible every day to move God's kingdom closer. Be it a three or four-legged stool, God will provide all that is needed for that to happen.

If your life is feeling it lacks the drive and purpose you seek, remember the core values of Faith, Study and Action. The backbone of your early disciplines will provide the stability you need to reach deep into those special places where you'll find your treasure.

Keeping Lent

As a younger person looking ahead to the benefits of being older - children off to college, working days in the past – the idea of cocooning through the months of January and February seemed particularly attractive to me. I imagined curling up in a big, old chair by a sunny window or the fireplace and reading books to my heart's content. This idyllic illusion was shattered for me when we moved in next door to a recently retired couple. They too, liked the idea of staying in, warmed by the fire. They had a small sunroom with a cast iron stove in it, which they named, in jest, their Florida room. Much as they just wanted to be at home, it never failed that they would have a medical appointment with a specialist or visit to the dentist on the stormiest days of winter. Days of peace, quiet and contemplation do not necessarily come easily no matter your age and stage of life. In a number of place in the gospels, we read that Jesus went off by himself to spend time resting from the demands of the crowds and to be in a quiet and receptive place to listen to messages from his heavenly father, to pray. As followers of Jesus, we not only try to live as he taught us through his

stories, parables and interactions with the people around him but we also try to emulate how he lived. Walking on water, feeding thousands and healing people of their illnesses seems to be beyond what we can do but in most other things, we are quite capable of copying Jesus' behavior. We can treat others with kindness and acceptance. We can listen to each other. We can provide caring support. And like Jesus, sometimes we will find we would benefit from withdrawing to a quiet place for pray, contemplation and just resting in God's presence.

On February 14, we enter the liturgical season of Lent. The ancient church built the season of Lent into the church calendar to create just such a time to pause and reflect. It provides a time for us to review our Rule of Life. We may want to add something to our devotions even if only for the season of Lent. This is keeping a holy Lent. We are encouraged to give charitably. Special study in Lent grew out of the practice of the early church which prepared candidates to be baptized at the Easter Vigil by teaching them the faith during Lent. A very common tradition is to give up something we particularly enjoy during Lent. Our small sacrifice is meant to remind us of the much greater sacrifice made for us by Christ on the cross.

So, let's think of Lent as an opportunity; an opportunity to grow towards the full stature of Christ through study, a time to work with our Cursillo Groups as a way to enhance Faith, Study and Action in our lives and especially as an opportunity for rest and refreshment, spending quiet time resting in God's presence.
